## Power of Freedom and Activism: Ukrainian Alternative to Militant Authoritarianism



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### Ubi solitudinem faciunt, pacem appellant

"Where they make a desert, they call it peace"





- Massive damage of infrastructure, including more than 50% of energy infrastructure of Ukraine is damaged), housing, agriculture, industry, cultural, etc
- Massive war crimes against civilians, captured, imprisoned, people's imprisoning, tortures, killings and deportation
- More than 11000 of children were forced deported from occupied territories of Ukraine to russia
- Ecological catastrophe: impact of war to ecosystems, fires and air pollution, chemical attacks and pollution after missels&bobming etc
- Mass changes in population: depopulation, internal displacement, refugee, war\occupation trauma...
- Destruction by shelling and bombing:
- more than 2.6 thousand educational institutions,
- About 600 objects of cultural heritage, cultural and religious buildings...
- Nuclear threat: nuclear power plant (Chernobyl, Zaporizhzhia NPP is the largest in Europe) occupied and bombed by russia; russia's terrorism with threating to use nuclear weapons



### European VS. Eurasian (Russian) some basic civilizational differences



- 1. Self-consciousness: Europeans, unique civilization
- 2. Political and social order: Embedded democracy, active (strong) civil society
- 3. Values of human life and individual freedom

- 4. Legal consciousness
- 5. Institutionalization of power, rational bureaucracy
- 6. Violence rejection



- 1. Self-consciousness: Russians, unique civilization
- Political and social order: Embedded autocracy inclined to totalitarianism, lack (weak) of civil society
- 3. Etatistic values (state as a single space of power distributed hierarchically; strong state dependence of the individuals)
- **4. Illegal consciousness,** rule avoidance
- 5. Personalization of power, patrimonial bureaucracy
- **6.** Violence acceptance of , abuse

- ✓ VCIOM, March 2023: 62% of Russians say they have felt more pride in Russia over the recent year;
- ✓ 68% support the war against Ukraine in 2023, that even higher than at the beginning of the war, which was 65% (May 2022).











### > What indicates a society's civilizational choice and its resilience?




Structuration theory (E.Giddens) & Morphogenetic approach (M.Archer): intersection of structures, culture and agency

### Ukraine's resilience formula:

or unexpected consequences of the russia's war against Ukrainian

- a. Reinforcement of national spirit and identity
- b. Rallying around key values, trust and believes: *freedom, democracy, pro-EU and pro-NATO orientations, Ukrainian culture, believe in Victory*
- c. Sense of personal belonging to the national resistance to the enemy (="russians"), successful coping strategies of personal resilience
- d. Civic activism, affirmation of responsible civil society
- e. Strengthen grass-rooted democracy, legitimacy of political leadership, main institutions and authority




### b. Geopolitical attitudes



### Support of Ukraine's joining the EU, Sociological Rating Group's data, Dec.2013 – Jan. 2023



### c. Sense of belonging to the Ukrainian national resistance to the enemy, Kyiv International Institute of Sociology's data, Oct. 21-23, 2022




### d. Activism: volunteering as mass practices of resistance and a part of national identity, Kyiv International Institute of Sociology's data, Sept. 2022





#### Conclusions:

- For centuries, Ukraine has balanced between two civilizations: European and Eurasian. The struggle for national identity and independence has been the leitmotif of Ukraine's millenniumlong history.
- During post-Soviet transformations, through three revolutions and the russia' war, Ukraine made its civilizational choice in favor of European civilizational prospect
- The russia's war against Ukraine since 2014 is driven by it's neo-imperial ambitions to maintain dominance over Ukraine and to keep it within the realm of Eurasian civilization
- This war has become a catalyst for Ukraine's rational choice of embracing the European civilizational prospect
- The pillar of resilience in this choice is a constellation of:
  - values of European geopolitical choice, freedom and national independence,
  - personal belonging to national resistance force,
  - civil responsibility and activism,
  - trust in key institutions and a positive vision of society's prospects
- The remarkable transformation of Ukrainian society is not only about a transformation of Ukrainian nation. It is also about the extension of European values to the east.
